#### THE PRAYER OF PREPARATION



## **THE SERMON**

We stand

#### THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in God.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

Who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, Who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.

We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.



#### **Postlude**

Chorale Prelude BWV 744: 'Auf mein lieben Gott trau ich'
In my loving God I trust

Johann Sebastian Bach 1685-1750

Bach composed several cantatas based upon various texts from the scriptures which covered all occasions of the liturgical year. This Chorale is based on the text 'In my beloved God I trust' and was composed by Bach during his time as Thomaskantor in Leipzig, a post he held from 1723-1750. In Latin the official historic title of the Thomaskantor was, Cantor et Director Musices, which describes the two functions of cantor and director. As the cantor, Bach prepared the choir for services in four Lutheran churches: Thomaskirche (St. Thomas), Nikolaikirche (St. Nicholas), Neue Kirche (New Church) and Peterskirche (St. Peter). In addition, he had to compose and take care of copying, rehearsals and performances. In the role of director of music, he was regarded as the senior musician in Leipzig, and organised music for city functions such as town council elections and homages.
