### Thought for the Month



We often think of November as the month of remembrance. This year at St. Margaret's we will begin the remembrance season early by holding our Service of Light, Hope and Remembrance on Friday 28<sup>th</sup> October and celebrating All Saints Day on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> October. Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> November will be Remembrance Sunday, and 27<sup>th</sup> November is Advent Sunday. In the midst of all this, of course, comes 5<sup>th</sup> November and remembrance of a different kind.

A perhaps lesser-known November date is Stir-up Sunday, traditionally the week before Advent Sunday, and this year it falls on 20<sup>th</sup> November. The title originates from the Book of Common Prayer collect for the day, which begins: "Stir up, we beseech thee, O Lord, the wills of thy faithful people". It's a call to Christians to prepare for the season of Advent. In Victorian times, however, Stir-up Sunday became associated with the preparation not of our wills but of Christmas puddings!

Some say the Christmas pudding was introduced to this country by Prince Albert. Several Christian traditions are associated with it. It would be prepared about five weeks before it was to be eaten, and was supposed to contain thirteen different ingredients, representing Jesus and his twelve disciples. Stir-up Sunday was a family event, with members taking it in turns to stir the mixture while making a wish. Stirring should be from east to west, in memory of the magi who came from the east to visit the baby King. Some families would include a silver coin, with whoever found it in their portion thought to receive good health, wealth and happiness in the coming year.

On Christmas Day, a sprig of holly would be inserted into the top of the pudding, representing Jesus' crown of thorns. Brandy was poured over it, then lit before the pudding was carried ceremoniously – and carefully - to the table.

I wonder how many of us follow these traditions today? They are a lovely way of reminding us, and our families, of what Advent is all about – looking forward to the celebration of the birth of our Saviour, and linking it with God's purpose in sending him into the world.


