## THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

## THE LORD'S PRAYER


Our Father in heaven,

## Plein Jeu from 5e Livre Louis Marchand 1669-1732

Louis Marchand was a French organist, harpsichordist and composer. Born into an organist's family, Marchand was a child prodigy and quickly established himself as one of the best known French virtuosos of his time. A colourful character, he worked as organist of numerous churches and, for a few years, as one of the four organistes du roy. Very little of his music still survives.
