All **Amen. Lord, have mercy.**


Celebrant God so loved the world that he gave his only Son Jesus Christ to save us from our sins, to be our advocate in heaven, and to bring us to eternal life.
Let us confess our sins in penitence and faith, firmly resolved to keep God's commandments and to live in love and peace with all.



Tuba Tune in D Major, Opus 15

Craig Sellar Lang 1891-1971

C.S. Lang was born in Hastings, New Zealand, and was a pupil of Walter Parratt and Charles Stanford at the Royal College of Music. His best-known work is the Tuba Tune for organ, Opus 15, which owes its title to the lively melody played on the organ's tuba stop. It begins in the style of Handel and, in its central section, has some brief key changes that could only belong to the 20th Century. CS Lang's choral music includes service settings, such as the Magnificat and Nunc Dimittis in B flat, Op.16, and anthems such as 'He shall give his angels charge over thee' composed in 1941. There are also many anthems for trebles' voices, composed for use at Christ's Hospital, as well as numerous secular choral works.
