I understand that labels on envelopes (guilty as charged in the past) renders the envelopes non-recyclable. Anything foil or plastic will need to be deeply considered as I try to lead by example. Also, the contents of a gift – will it damage the ocean or planet in any way? A good way to question ourselves is to ask,

before we buy it, 'how will this be disposed of?'. The same thoughts are applied to the food and its packaging that I will buy. I know I will likely fail, but at least I will do my best and try hard.
