THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in God.

All **We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God
from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made,

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven,
was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and
was made man.
For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;
he suffered death and was buried.
On the third day he rose again in accordance with the
Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the
right hand of the Father.
He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead,
and his kingdom will have no end.
We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who
proceeds from the Father and the Son,
who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and
glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.
We believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the
world to come. Amen.**

Josef Rheinberger 1839-1901

Josef Rheinberger was a child prodigy. He began studies in music at a very young age, by the age of 7 he was serving as organist in his parish church. As a composer he was remarkable for his power of invention, masterful technique, and a noble, solid style. He set many liturgical texts to music, twelve masses, a Requiem, Stabat Mater, and a large number of motets. Rheinberger's masses rank high as works of art and can be used for liturgical purposes.
