THE PRAYER OF PREPARATION



THE EUCHARISTIC PRAYER


The Lord be with you And also with you

Heaven and earth are full of your glory.


Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest.

Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Pray for us.

Franz Liszt was born in Hungary and became one of the great virtuosi of his time. Towards the latter part of his life much of his composition work was of a religious nature and he took minor orders in the Catholic Church. The melody of the litany: Ora Pro Nobis, 'Pray for us' was brought to Rome from Jerusalem by Princess Caterina Hohenzollern, Liszt arranged it for organ in 1864 and dedicated it to Monsignor Gustav von Hohenlohe, who would later become a Cardinal. It was from Mgr. Gustav that Liszt was to receive the tonsure in the Vatican in 1865.
