Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.


For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Full Chorus François Couperin 1668-1733

François Couperin was born in Paris to a prominent musical family. His father was organist of the Church of Saint Gervaise Saint Protais in Paris and on his death, when Francois was eleven years old, Francois inherited the position of organist. At the age of eighteen Couperin became titular organist of the Church a position he held until his death. Today's postlude comes from two organ masses composed by Couperin. The second of these, the Messe Pour les Convents is composed specifically for use in convents and monasteries in France. The first one was composed for parish use.
