PRAYERS OF PENITENCE


Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence,

THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in God.

We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,
the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father,
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made,
of one Being with the Father;

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was in

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;

he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

The Lord be with you And also with you


Lift up your hearts.

as we forgive those who sin against us.


Lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Postlude

Praeludium and Fuga BWV558 No VI from Eight Little Preludes and Fugues Johann Sebastian Bach 1685-1750

The authorship of the Eight Little Preludes and Fugues is debated, some argue they were composed by a pupil of Bach. e composed during the years 1708-1717. The G minor prelude here is similar to an Italian courante (a court dance for couples prominent in the late 16th Century. The fugue is very symmetrical in structure with a subject and one strong rhythmic or melodic motive. The pedal has a purely harmonic function. reflecting the influences of other composers of the period including Bach
