#### THE AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

Let us declare our faith in God.

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen. We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made.

For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary and was made man.

For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried.

On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son,

who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.

We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.






The priest praises God for his mighty acts and at the end we sing

#### **Postlude**

Sonata No 2, Op 87a, Introduction, Edward Elgar 1857-1934

Edward Elgar was brought up in the Catholic faith and played the organ at St Georges Roman Catholic Church in Worcester, he attended services in the (Anglican) Worcester Cathedral as regularly as those at his own church. Perhaps his most well-known work is The Dream of Gerontius, a setting of a poem by Cardinal St John Henry Newman which explores various tenets of the Catholic faith. Originally composed as a test piece for the National Brass Band Championship, this postlude is from No 1 'The Severn Suite' a late work composed in 1930. It is named after the river Severn which runs through the city of Worcester, where he had been brought up and lived much of his life. This arrangement is by Ivor Atkins, 1869-1953, who was himself a friend of Elag and organist and choirmaster at Worcester Cathedral.
